• We have after school tutoring for third grade students. We provide a remedial pull-out program for students, called The Zone. We conduct RTI meetings every 3 weeks on struggling students to discuss strategies and programs for them. We have a campus zero tolerance for bullying. We participate in the Capturing Kids Hearts staff training/school climate. Staff training and campus procedures and lesson plans are in place through the PBIS (positive behavior interventions and support). We serve students through the Bridges/SOI lab to prepare them for learning and strengthen their focusing and sensory motor skills. The AR program is supported by all staff. We have a partnership with an ESC14 consultant. Anti-bullying programs are offered and an anti-bullying tip line is available district-wide for reporting bullying. The school counselor is available for all students and conducts attendance conferences with the student and parents when a student accumulates six absences. In addition, the attendance clerk sends a warning letter to the parents when a student reaches four absences. Perfect and Prompt/Regular attendance are rewarded during the End of the Year Assembly. At this assembly, two students' names with perfect attendance will be drawn for a bicycle. Special needs students are identified in order to serve them appropriately. Proper IEP implementation is in place. A school climate/culture survey is conducted annually to evaluate the programs at the school so that we may better serve our students.
